ARTICLE II: Shall the School District raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling \$4,978,254. Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$4,845,970 which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the School District or by law or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. (The School Board recommends this appropriation.) (The Budget Committee recommends this appropriation.)

ARTICLE III: To see if the School District will vote to approve the cost items included in the Collective Bargaining Agreement reached between the Madison School Board and the Madison Educational Association, which calls for the following increases in salaries and benefits at the current staffing levels:

Year 2011-2012	\$28,971
Year 2012-2013	\$78,858

and further to raise and appropriate the sum of forty-six thousand twenty nine dollars (\$46,029) for the 2010-2011 fiscal year, such sum representing the additional costs attributable to the increase in salaries and benefits over those of the appropriation at current staffing levels paid in the prior fiscal year. (The School Board recommends this appropriation.) (The Budget Committee recommends this appropriation.)

ARTICLE IV: Shall the voters of Madison School District adopt a school administrative unit budget of \$ 580,252 for the 2010-2011 fiscal year in which \$202,507.94 is assigned to the school budget of this school district. (The School Board recommends this appropriation.) (The Budget Committee recommends this appropriation.)

This year's adjusted budget of \$ 549,167 with \$191,659.28 assigned to the school district budget will be adopted if the article does not receive a majority vote of all of the district voters voting in this administrative unit.

ARTICLE V: To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate, from surplus, the sum of up to \$20,000 to be placed in the capital reserve fund previously established for the purpose of educating educationally disabled children, with such appropriation to be funded from the June 30 unreserved fund balance. (The School Board recommends this appropriation.) (The Budget Committee recommends this appropriation.)

ARTICLE IX: To see if the School District will vote to establish a Building Repairs Capital Reserve Fund and to raise and appropriate, from surplus, the sum of up to \$10,000 to be placed in this fund, with such amount to be funded from the June 30 unreserved fund balance and to designate the School Board as agents to expend. (Majority vote required) (The School Board recommends this appropriation.) (The Budget Committee recommends this appropriation.)

ARTICLE X: Shall the School District of Madison vote to raise and appropriate the sum of thirty one thousand one hundred twenty-seven dollars (\$31,127) for the purpose of offering full day kindergarten, of which ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) is to be used for a one-time expenditure for costs of renovations, furniture and supplies. (The School Board recommends this appropriation.) (The Budget Committee recommends this appropriation.)

ARTICLE XI: To see if the voters of the Madison School District direct the School Board to support any and all efforts of the New Hampshire School Boards Association to seek legislative repeal of RSA 273-A:12, Section VII., the provision in statute commonly referred to as the statutory "Evergreen Clause", to restore local control in the collective bargaining and school district budget processes. (The School Board recommends this article.)

(The School Board recommends this appropriation.) (The Budget Committee recommends this appropriation.)
